- ◆ **A video demonstration** by [Patrick De Florio \(Yankee Glassblower\)](#) of **Sealing Sapphire Tubing to Borosilicate Tubing** with no intermediate glasses. Patrick will answer your questions after the video.
- ◆ **A video demonstration** by [Tracy Drier \(University of Wisconsin Madison\)](#) of materials used and how to make the Wisconsin **Fire Shield Hand Protector**, useful for high temperature situations where you don't want to wear a bulky insulating glove. A PDF pattern to make your own will be available. Tracy will discuss the materials and process after the video.
- ◆ Given enough time after the demos, there will be an unscripted open-mic **technical questions and answers forum**. You are welcome to bring your scientific glass questions to the call. Chances are someone has an answer for you.
